GRADING STRUCTURE:

Worksheets: Worksheets are available online at www.ccchemistry.us. (This page is not accessible via the college web page.) Worksheets will be collected at the instructor's discretion.

Quizzes (100 pt): All quizzes will be announced. NO MAKE -UP QUIZZES will be given. At the end of the semester your lowest quiz score will be dropped.

Exams (400 pt): Five 100-point exams will be given. The lowest of the first four exam scores will be dropped. NO MAKE-UP EXAMS will be given. If you miss one of the first four exams, this will count as the exam that is dropped. Your exam 5 score will not be dropped, even if it is the lowest of the semester. Exam study guides are available online.

Assigned Textbook Problems: see Lecture Schedule (on reverse side).

Course Grade: Your grade in the lecture will be worth 75% and your grade in the laboratory will be worth 25% of your overall grade in the course. If you fail (average less than 55%) either the lab or the lecture, you will receive an F in the course.
